• School and career guidance is a crucial area of intervention for individuals and society.

- Despite its importance, the guidance service does not always succeed in achieving its objectives.
- The professionalisation of head teachers is a promising way of improving the effectiveness of school guidance.



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- Definition: Educational and vocational guidance is a set of activities designed to help individuals make educational, training and occupational choices.
- Objectives : Educational and vocational guidance aims to help individuals to :
 - Make informed choices consistent with their aspirations and abilities.
 - Fulfil their personal and professional potential.
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- Lack of resources: School and career guidance services often lack human and material resources.
- Insufficient training of professionals : Guidance professionals are not always sufficiently trained to provide effective support for students.
- Disparate practices: Guidance practices vary from one school to another, which can create inequalities in access to a quality service.



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- Definition : The professionalisation of primary teachers is a process aimed at developing the skills and knowledge of primary teachers in the field of educational and vocational guidance.
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- More personalised support : head teachers can offer more individualised support to pupils.
- Better collaboration with parents : Head teachers can work more closely with parents to help students choose the right career path.
- Stronger links with the world of work : Senior teachers can better guide pupils towards training and careers that meet the needs of the labour market.



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- It enables them to better support pupils in their career choices and contribute to their success.
- It is important to implement public policies to support the professionalisation of head teachers.



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
